# Day 1 Findings - New Orleans 2025 Mayoral Race

# 1. Overall Polling Results

If the election were held today:

- Royce Duplessis leads significantly with 55% of the total vote (163 votes).
- Helena Moreno follows with 18% (54 votes).
- Oliver Thomas ranks third at 16% (48 votes).
- Ricky Twiggs surprises with 9% (26 votes).
- Arthur Hunter receives 2% (5 votes).
- Tyrell Morris was disqualified and not listed on the final ballot.

## 2. Voter Demographics


- Political Affiliation:
  - Democrat: 76%
  - o Independent: 21%
  - o Republican: 3%
- Age Breakdown:
  - o 41–50: 33%
  - o 36-40: 21%



- o 30–35: 14%
- o 60+: 12%
- 0 18–24: 7%
- Campaign Engagement:
  - o 53% have previously participated in a political campaign.
- Voting Likelihood:
  - o 97% say they are "Very Likely" to vote in the October 11 election.
- Top Voter Issues (Multi-Selection):
  - o Infrastructure (roads, drainage): 20%
  - o Economic Development & Jobs: 19%
  - o Crime & Public Safety: 19%
  - o Affordable Housing: 15%
  - o Education: 14%.



### 3. Ward-Level Results



### **Duplessis Dominance**

Royce Duplessis is the leading candidate in 12 out of 17 wards, including:

- Ward 9: Most responses (80 total) Duplessis won 43.75%
- Ward 7: Major swing ward Duplessis led with 60.66%
- Ward 15 & 17: Strong leads over multiple challengers

#### Moreno Performance

- Leads only in Ward 4 (33.3%), Ward 6 (37.5%), and Ward 14 (50%)
- Faces challenges converting name recognition into dominance on the ground

#### **Oliver Thomas**

- Leads in Ward 1 (tied at 50%) and Ward 13 (37.5%)
- Still competitive in mid-density areas



### Ricky Twiggs

- Strongest surprise showing in Ward 15 (8 votes), totaling 9% citywide
- May be siphoning younger or protest votes from traditional candidates

# **Key Takeaways**

#### Ward Trends

- Wards 7 and 9 are shaping up as the 2025 battlegrounds—both are dense, culturally influential, and split across generational lines.
- Duplessis' dominance in outer and inner wards suggests cross-demographic appeal.

## **Electability Snapshot**

- The combined 73% support for Duplessis, Moreno, and Thomas points to a heavily name-driven early race.
- Twiggs' near-double-digit showing warrants closer media attention, especially among anti-establishment voters.
